Mr. Jamieson, seconded by Mr. MacEachen, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-2, An Act to amend the Canada Shipping Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and recommendation of the Governor General printed pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Governor General recommends to the House of Commons a measure to amend the Canada Shipping Act to provide for the establishment in the Consolidated Revenue Fund of an account to be known as the Maritime Pollution Claims Fund, and for the appointment, tenure of office, duties and powers of an Administrator of the Fund and for the costs and expenses incurred by the Administrator; to provide for the making of regulations prohibiting discharge from ships of pollutants; to provide for the appointment and

powers of pollution control officers and analysts; to provide for civil liability resulting from the discharge of pollutants and the assessment of income losses by fishermen; to provide also for payments into and out of the Fund; and to provide further for other matters related to the administration of new Part XIX of the Canada Shipping Act.

Mr. Benson, seconded by Mr. MacEachen, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-3, An Act respecting investment companies, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.
