Referring to your letter to me of January 10th, 1953, I now wish to inform you that the R.C.M.P. have now completed their investigation and their report discloses that a copy of a draft of the report by Mr. George S. Currie was stolen from a printing shop in Montreal between November 25th and November 29th, 1952. In our opinion there

is sufficient evidence to identify the person who took the report and warrant a criminal charge against him.

Following normal police practices, the facts as disclosed by the investigation have been made known to Mr. Currie.
