POINT OF ORDER

MR. HNATYSHYN—STATEMENT OF MR. TRUDEAU RESPECTING PROCEEDINGS INVOLVING MR. SIMMONS

Hon. Ray Hnatyshyn (Saskatoon West): Madam Speaker, I want to raise a point of order with respect to the comments made by the Prime Minister (Mr. Trudeau) in an answer he gave my colleague, the Hon. Member for St. John's East (Mr. McGrath). There is a principle of parliamentary tradition in the House that there shall not be any attempt to interfere with the judicial process. If I understood the words of the Prime Minister, his statement was a direct reflection on upcoming proceedings involving the Hon. Member for Burin-St. George's (Mr. Simmons), the implication being in connection with the proceedings that the future of that Hon. Member in the Cabinet would depend upon the outcome of a hearing with respect to the charges against the Hon. Member.

Madam Speaker: Order, please. That is not a point of order; that is a matter of debate. The Hon. Member cannot raise that point now and try to continue Question Period under the guise of a point of order. That is not a point of order.

Mr. Hnatyshyn: Madam Speaker, I simply wanted to raise it. I would like to have a look at the Prime Minister's exact words.

Madam Speaker: All right, I need no notice of that. The Hon. Member can look at it and raise it, if he thinks he has a
