Dear Sir Artnur:-I am enclosing a cutting from the Globe, Wednesday, Oct. 11th., with reference to attendance at the Ontario Agricultural college. I should like to draw your attention to two facts:-1. That only 36 men entered the degree course at Guelph this year; 2. That in their two-year course a large percentage dropped out - in 1921, a loss of 40 percent and in 1922, a loss of 37 percent. This seems to point out that a one-year course might have some advantages, and you will remember that we have adopted the latter procedure. considering the large population from which the Ontario Agricultural College draws its students, 36 men entering the degree course is certainly small and does not compare favorably with our entry from this province. I thought you might like to see these figures. I am also sending you, under separate cover, a reprint of my paper on "The Red Discoloration of Cured Codfish". Faithfully yours. Esturiosa. Principal.
