

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL H⁸.

An Act for the relief of Pearl Agnes Harding Potvin.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Pearl Agnes Harding Potvin, residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, telephone operator, wife of Stanley Nelson Potvin, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the town of Sweetsburg, in the said province, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the twenty-sixth day of January, A.D. 1947, at the city of St. Johns, in the said province, she then being Pearl Agnes Harding, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Pearl Agnes Harding and Stanley Nelson Potvin, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Pearl Agnes Harding may at any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Stanley Nelson Potvin had not been solemnized.
