"I wish a very happy Christmas to all ranks of the Canadian corps. Christmas in each year since 1914 brought a message of hope, but the hearts of our people at home were heavy and full of forebodings. We on the torn fields of battle could only harden our purpose to keep on fighting until Christianity and civilization were vindicated and re-established. "And now we have reached our goal. The foe is vanquished, the powers of darkness are defeated. We can this year celebrate with joy the anniversary of the birth of Christ, the prince of peace.

"The message to our people in Canada is: "Be happy this Christmas. We have won. We will soon be home. From the great beyond our fallen comrades—ever present in our hearts—bid us all to be happy. Christ is born again."
