England would not be the great world power she is to-day if it was not for her mexhaustible supply of coal.

Coal is the basis of all industrial and commercial wealth.

Coal-mining in British Columbia has always been a great success. It is great deal like diamond-mining in South Africa—a bonanza of the first magnitude.

The great mountain barrier of the Rockies shuts out the eastern coal, leaving the great Pacific coast to be supplied by the British Columbia fields, excepting a small tonnage from the State of Washington of a very inferior quality; in fact, so poor that the United States navy of the Pacific division get all of their supply from the Dunsmuir Coal Mines on Vancouver Island, and pay-the duty on it, but, neithen the Washington nor the Vancouver Island coal is of any use for furnace and smelters coke, because the coal from both of these places contains a great deal of sulphus, and does not make good smelters coke.
