YEARLY GRANT FROM CITY TO FIREMEN'S BENEFIT FUND

Donation of \$8750 Favorably Considered—Exhibition Board Surplus—City Hall Notes.

There is a decided probability that the firemen's benefit fund will be supplemented by a yearly grant from the city of between \$8000 and \$9000. Controller Hubbard introduced the subject at yesterday's meeting of the first and light committee. At the beginning of the year the fund was found to be in very uncertain condition. There were great difficulties in its way owing to the conditions being different from those in the United States, where three per cent. of the sum obtained yearly from licenses was thrown into the fund.

The actuary's report had suggested a bylaw to set aside about \$23,000, but this idea had been abandoned because of strong opposition was thought to exist.

The city solicitor was quoted as saying that the establishing and maintaining of such a fund yearly by council was allowable. At present the men paid in between \$7000 and \$8000 yearly, being paid in weekly instalments. The city should provide an equal amount, or one larger and after a certain number of years this would provide for a sinking fund, and the provision should be made a permanent one, and not subject to change from year to year.

Locally and Morally Bound.
Ald. Fleming believed that the city was legally as well as morally bound to continue the fund and that \$8750 paid over each year would place the fund in a healthy condition. In about five years the city's contribution would be equal to that of the men, and at that time about 20 of the present members of the department would have to be paid off and in ten years 10 or 15 more of the men.

\$800,000 for Lighting Plant.
The city engineer reported that it would cost the city \$800,000 to establish a municipal electric lighting plant sufficient to supply 1500 lamps with Niagara power, making provision for the wires of 100 lamps to be laid underground. Mr. Rust said he could estimate the cost of the Toronto Electric Light Co.'s plant, the assessed value of which stood on the city's rolls as \$1,200,000.

A deputation from the board of trade, headed by President J. H. Howland, informed the committee that recommendations as to changing the building bylaw were to be made in the building bylaw for New York State, now being revised, had been considered.

The city will receive a cheque of \$27,579.33 from the exhibition board, representing profits of the 1906 fair, after allowing over \$9000 for new buildings.

When the city council is the chief promoter of the Cataract Power Company's scheme, the council to grant right of way to the railway, Ald. Macleod moved that the question be submitted to the people. Ald. Stewart supported this idea and said that he would be glad to see the question of the parks. Findlay was a strong advocate of John Patterson's proposal and went to Ottawa with Patterson and his associates to secure the approval of the minister of railways. Check by Jowl.
