RACE DECADENCE A GREAT DANGER

Highest Birthrate Is in Lowest Social Class-Population Weakens.

London, Sept. 18.-Widespread attention has been attracted by the alarmist opinions expressed on certain vital social problems by Sir James Crichton-Browne in his presidential address to the sanitary inspectors' congress. He discussed race suicide not from the point of view of a falling birth rate, but in regard to the close relationship existing between undesirablt social conditions and a high birth

He quoted startling statistics which proved that in districts where there was overcrowding, where there was a superabundance of the lowest type of labor, where infant mortality was greatest, where there was the most general pauperism, where signs of bad environment, like phthisis, were most abundant, and where pauper lunatics were most numerous, the wives of reproductive ages had the most children.
