NEVILLS IS ACQUITTED AN ALIBI IS PROVEN

Chief Smith Denied That Constable Had Told Him About Identity of His Assailant.

HAMILTON, June 11.—(Special.)—"Not guilty" was the verdict brought in this afternoon by the jury that tried John Nevills on the charge of shooting Constable Harry Smith March 4. The jury was out an hour and a quarter. The constable sworn positively that Nevills was the man, and declared that while he was in the hospital he told Chief Smith so. The chief was called by the defence and said the constable did not tell him. The defence also established an alibi. M. J. O'Reilly, K.C., defended.
