the masses from the ravages of imure milk. After 15 years of striving pure milk it was found that only half of I per cent of the milk con-sumed in the United States came up to the standard fixed by the commissioners:
Dr. Charles J. C. O. Hastings of Toronto, who returned yesterday from the south, where he attended the con-

ference, says the ideal of an officially certified pure milk supply had not geen abandoned as impossible of at-airment, altho the figures were rather discouraging, yet the propaganda would be kept up, but in the mean time pasteurization, which all agreed renders milk fit for use and involves little labor, will be recommended.

Pasteurization simply means to submit the milk to 150 degrees Fanrenheit for 20 minutes, and then lowering it 40 or 45 degrees and maintaining at that temperature until used. Hastings says pasteurization should be carried out under official supervision. The present treatment given milk Toronto, he says, is merely a false security, and is no pasteurization at all. Pamphlets will be issued by the commissioners explaining pasteurization and its uses, and pending proper action by the health authorities the users of milk will be encouraged

to use only milk which has been pro-perly treated officially.
