

HOCKEY VARSITY - 5 KITCHENER 1

PLAY-OFF IS NECESSARY WHEN STUDENTS WIN

Varsity Pull Away From Kitchener in Third Round After Forty Minutes of Bang-Up Hockey — Box Dislocates Elbow Early in the Game.

The pinch-hitting Varsity team tied up the second hole in the O.H.A. senior race by defeating Kitchener, 5 to 1, at the Arena last night, making a play-off in Hamilton necessary on Thursday night. The winner of the Thursday clash will meet Granites in the senior finals on March 1 and 4.

Last night's effort was one of the best of the season, and a rip-roaring and awe-inspiring affair, until Varsity opened a final flurry in the last period and drew away. Connaught Cup to Be Fought for Between New York and Ottawa Team.

Ottawa, Feb. 22.—The United States has challenged Canada for the possession of the Connaught Trophy for figure skating, possession of which has been held by the Minto Skating Club since 1914. A team of four from the New York Skating Club will arrive on Saturday morning for the competition, to be held here on Monday evening, Feb. 23.

The referee of this contest will decide whether or not the trophy, emblematic of the figure-skating championship of America, is to remain in Ottawa or find a new home.

The Connaught Cup was first offered for perpetual competition in 1914 by His Majesty King George V. on the occasion of the visit of the Duke of Connaught. The trophy of the competition was, briefly, that it was to be contested on the United States and Canada, and that a competition should be held each year if a challenge is made to the defenders, and in Ottawa.

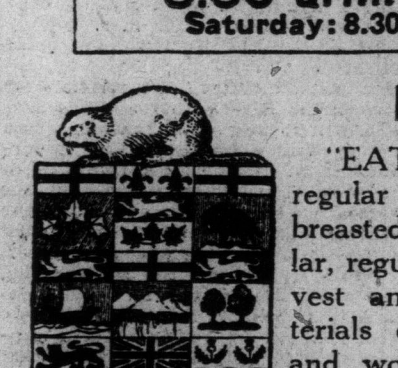
