

The true Late Strawberry we saw last September at Plattsburg, and the tree is very different in habit of growth from that which we describe. We had also sent specimens to Mr. Downing, who gave his final decision that it was not Late Strawberry. It is, however, clearly of Strawberry type, not quite

equal in flavor, but ever so much larger and more handsome. In quality it is quite good enough for a fruit for family use. Its size and color place it upon our exhibition tables in competition for the "best five varieties," and its early productiveness places it among the five most profitable as recommended by the Society.

WHITE WINTER CALVILLE (of Abbottsford) was described in Second Report Montreal Horticultural Society, p. 26. It is a mid-winter fruit of medium size and fine quality. The tree is very productive, and, we think, is specially suited to lightish soils; it has, however, the sad fault of being a pale yellow in color. It does not bruise easily, but shows its bruises readily. In spite of
