NOW HAVE \$2,200.

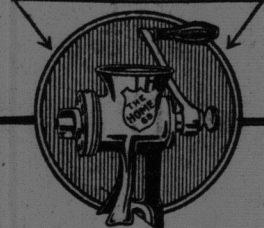
