MORE MEN NEEDED

London, May 15.—Richard Reid, the agent-general for Ontario, says his visit to the front raised Canadians in his estimate higher than ever, but he was also impressed with the urgent need of still more men and more munitions of war. Lord Haldane's announcement in the house of lords is generally accepted as a preliminary warning of the changed attitude of the government toward conscription. Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, who says he does not favor conscription, admits that everyone should pocket his individual beliefs, and decide to beat the Germans, at all costs.


