I left the Commodore Hotel at 1.15 o'clock and the taxi I had hired toon landed me at the Polo grounds, or as near as we could get, owing to the immense crowds which were swarming around the various entrances of the home of the Giants.

Policemen, firemen and ushers were bowerless in that great bulging sea of aumanity. They were thrown hither and thither in their efforts to pilot ticket-holders to their seats. Even when the preliminaries were called and were being fought the crowds swarmed m. To watch them was of far more m. To watch them was of far more nterest than the minors who were per-orming in the ring. wd Storms Gates.

The vast crowd kept storming the entrances until five minutes before the hain bout started. The ringside seats retched 150 yards on the four sides of the ring—that is, those that were on the dead level. Back of these the seats graduated in elevation to the height of

four feet.

I had a feeling that my seat was not to hold me long. For a few minutes before the main bout started the crowd grew restless. The fans began to stand, first on the ground and then an the benches in the ringside seats. I was two seats from the aisle. I had a feeling that something was going to happen. I slipped out to the aisle and watched my chance to reach the ring-side.

My dope was right. Soon all the tans were on their feet and standing on the benches. The police and firemen were helpless. The crowd remained standing. 
