

## TELLS GRIPPING STORY OF FIGHT

James Power Says Dempsey is Undoubted King—Ringside Scenes.

I have returned from the Dempsey-Firpo fight in New York much wiser regarding the fighting game. I have returned with far more respect for Jack Dempsey than when I left St. John.

Dempsey is the greatest fighter that ever lived and it will always be a marvel to me how Tommy Gibbons stood up to the champion in their mill at Shelby, Montana.

Firpo will never have a look-in with Dempsey. His wonderful ability to take punishment will keep him among the top-notchers, but he is not in the same class with Dempsey. He may be able to stand up with Gibbons.

I had a wonderful experience in New York. I was one of the 85,000 fans who struggled to gain admission to the Polo grounds the evening of the great battle. I left the Commodore Hotel at 11 o'clock and the taxi I had hired soon landed me at the Polo grounds, or as near as we could get, owing to the immense crowds which were swarming around the various entrances of the home of the Giants.

Struggles for Seats.

After I entered the gate I struggled for fifteen minutes before I reached my seat, which was in the twelfth row of the ringside seats. It was a terrible jam even at this hour, fully three hours before the main bout was due to start.

I was thrown one way, and then another, as the crowd, scrambling for their seats, swayed this way and then that.

Finally I reached my seat, which was on a bench. What a thrill to watch that great mass of humanity pour into that vast amphitheatre, and what a sight it was to see row after row of seats, almost as far as the eye could see, being packed with human beings.

Police, firemen and ushers were powerless in that great bulging sea of humanity. They were thrown hither and thither in their efforts to pilot ticket-holders to their seats. Even when the preliminaries were called and were being fought the crowds swarmed on. To watch them was of far more interest than the minors who were performing in the ring.

Crowd Storms Gates.

The vast crowd kept storming the entrances until five minutes before the main bout started. The ringside seats stretched 100 yards on the four sides of the ring—that is, those that were on the dead level. Back of these seats graduated in elevation to the height of four feet.

I had a feeling that my seat was not to hold me long. For a few minutes before the main bout started the crowd grew restless. The fans began to stand, first on the ground and then on the benches in the ringside seats. I was two seats from the aisle. I had a feeling that something was going to happen. I slipped out to the aisle and watched my chance to reach the ringside.

My hope was right. Soon all the fans were on their feet and standing on the benches. The police and firemen were helpless. The crowd remained standing. Cautiously I worked my way ringward until I could put my chin on the floor of the ring. In this crouched position I waited. Others did the same. Some were forced back—I was among those who stayed.

Firpo Enters First.

Firpo was the first to enter the ring. He was cheered and he was booed—more cheers by far, though, than boos. He wore a checkered bath robe, black and white. He immediately went to his corner. His face was grave. He gave a slight smile when the crowd gave him a cheer.

**C. N. R. Plans Meet With Opposition**  
Halifax, Sept. 21. — In order that there may be more efficiency, better service and more economy, L. S. Brown, general manager of the Atlantic Region of the C. N. R., announced yesterday that an amalgamation at Halifax of the operating offices of the Canadian National Lines from Halifax to Truro and from Halifax to Yarmouth would be effected soon.  
The Truro Town Council sent a letter to the C. N. R. headquarters at Montreal yesterday protesting against the proposed change in conditions which have existed for 60 years.  
The Bridgewater Board of Trade passed a resolution protesting against the proposed change of the operating staff of the C. N. R. to Halifax, terming it "an outrageous action on the part of the Canadian National Railways management."
