Mr. Meighen's Complaint.

(Toronto's Globe.)

Mr. Meighen thinks that British Columbia ought to be proud of sending him and his party "seven good men, in the face of a tide of discontent and a rationality unrivaled in the history of elections." It is certainly remarkable that a province containing not much more than half a million people should have given Mr. Meighen nearly one-seventh of his parliamentary support, and Mr. Meighen does well to be grateful.

But when he speaks of the tide of irrationality and discontent that defeated him he shows that he does not know how to accept defeat. Discontent there was, but there was nothing irrational, wild or revolutionary in the attitude of the electors. It is easily explained. The Liberal party, divided by the issue raised in 1917, recovered to a large extent its unity and strength. A new party arose and elected more representatives than Mr. Meighen's followers. Mr. Meighen saw Bolshevistic tendencies in the movement, but this was the result of a heated partisan imagination. The farmer's occupation and his ownership of land and stock account for a streak of conservatism in his character. The fact that he chose political and constitutional methods is evidence that he is not carried away by revolutionary ideas.

Defeat was inevitable in any case, but it was perhaps made more disastrous by Mr. Meighen's methods. The Borden government, formed in 1917, was a union of Liberals and Conservatives for a particular purpose—a war government. When the war was over, and a reasonable period for demobilization had elapsed, there was no reason for continuing the temporary alliance. Liberal after Liberal left the government, but Mr. Meighen and some of his colleagues clung to the delusion that they could effect a permanent fusion of the two parties, or rather a swallowing of one by the other, with the Liberals in the humble capacity of food for their rivals. With this in view the fantastic name of
