Production figures of pig iron in Great Britain for July are now available. They show that, although the coal miners returned to work early in that month, only fifteen blast furnaces were operating in July, as against 109 before the coal strike, and 299 in July last year. The month's output of pig iron was only 19,200 tons, comparing with 386,000 in March, before the coal stoppage, and \$50,600 in July a year ago. Production of steel ingots and castings was 117,200 tons, compared with 359,100 in March, 789,000 in the previous July and 884,700 last September, the month of largest output since the armistice.
