Practicing medicine in the jungle bears little resemblance to practicing medicine in the United States, according to Dr. Weber. Even the diseases are different. Typhoid, diphtheria, scarlet fever, smallpox are unknown. Cancer and appendicitis are diseases of civilization, luckily foreign to the jungle tribes. A strange and terrible disease called "yaws," a virulent form of itch, and an especially deadly malaria are some of the principal troubles a jungle physician is called upon to alleviate.

The chief operative diseases are hernia, elephantiasis, and—jiggers! The West African jigger is not the comparatively meek little insect of American woods, but an energetic pest that will penetrate the horniest black foot in the jungle and cause indescribable torment unless it is removed.

Malaria is a curse in a country where every prospect pleases. It carries off 60 per cent. of the babies before they are a year old. It causes indescribable misery among older people. Before 1904, it took a toll of two missionaries a year. Since that time, the mission buildings have been thoroughly screened against the mosquito, and no missionaries have died of malaria. Cameroun needs a Gorgas, says Dr. Weber.
