The potato shippers of New Brunswick expect to export approximately 1,800,000 bushels of potatoes to Cubaduring the coming season, according to a statement made last night by Hon. B. F. Smith, of East Florenceville, Carleton county, president of the Associated Potato Shippers of New Brunswick, which concluded a two-days' business convention with Cuban dealers, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia representatives here yesterday

"Between 50 and 70 cargoes of New Brunswick potatoes will be shipped from the port of Saint John this sea-son, starting in September," Hon. Mr. Smith said last night. "This will be an appreciable increase over last year's shipments and our potato dealers are feeling most optimistic."

Senor J. A. Palacio, president of the Canadian American Trading Company, stated last night that the Cuban dealers present at the convention had made arrangements with Nova Scotia potato men to import about 120,000 barrels into Cuba this coming season. The matter of exporting hay and oats from the Maritime Provinces to Cuba was discussed at some length by the conference but no definite decision was arrived at.

COPENHAGEN, Aug. 14—Another attempt will be made by the world's foremost astronomers in 1931 to measure more accurately the earth's distance from the sun, according to plans to be submitted to the International Astronomic Congress which opens here tomorrow.

Although the present estimate of the earth's mean distance from the sun is placed at 92,897,400 miles, which is considered sufficiently accurate for all practical uses, it is believed that the position of the planet Eros in 1931, in its relative relation to the sun and the earth will afford an opportunity to make the estimate more exact than it is at present.
