Way back in 1888-89, an event of some importance to base ball history took place. It was the world's tour of professional National League base ball players, promoted, managed and carried through to a successful finish by the late A. G. Spalding. The teams that made the voyage were known as the Chicago and All-Americans.

Of all the players mentioned on both teams there is not an old-timer but will say that each and every one was a bright particular star in the base ball game, during the greater part of his major league career. One other celebrity who accompanied the team around the world was the cause of many a laugh, was a little negro boy, Clarence Duval, a ragged, little and forlorn urchin, who had been picked up the season before by the Chicago team and turned into a mascot and bat boy for the team—and by the way, he has the distinction of being the original human mascot in the history of the game.
