AGREEMENT made the 9th day of September A.D. 1925,

BETWEEN:

THE MARTINE FALLS BAND OF INDIANS, herein represented by
CHIEF GEORGE TAYLOR, hereinafter called the "Vendors",

of the First Part,

-and-

J. CAMPBELL, of the City of Port Arthur, in the District of
Thunder Bay, hereinafter called the "Purchaser",

of the Second Part,

WITNESSETH that the Vendors agree to sell to the Purchaser all
the timber and trees now standing, growing, lying or being on those certain parcels
of land described as the MARTINE FALLS INDIAN RESERVE, which lands are Indian Res-
ervations belonging to the said Vendors.

The consideration for the said sale shall be the following:-
timber on the
For All territory vested in the name of the said Band known as the Martine Falls
Indian Reserve, containing _____ miles square, situated
adjacent to Martine Falls. *Long Lake*

Payable as follows:-

Five hundred Dollars payable to the Band as soon as the
Government ratifies said Agreement, the same to be applied on monies due the
Band from the sale of the said Reserve.

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Ten

cents per tie for all No. One Jackpine ties.

Eight

cents per tie for all No. Two Jackpine ties.

Four

cents per tie for all No. Three Jackpine ties.

Fifty

cents per cord for all spruce pulpwood.

Twenty-five cents a stick for all Piling above fifty feet, and

Ten

cents a stick for all Piling under fifty feet.

The Purchaser agrees that the trees shall be felled with as much
care as possible, and in a workmanlike manner, and that he will do no unnecessary
damage to the said lands, or to the underbrush or crops, or to any road, building or
other improvement, and will repair any damage so done, or make compensation therefor, and for any
