SUDDEN DEATH OF RICHARD KIERNIN
Richard Kiernin, foreman of the big Indian mill of Sisson, Cutler & Co., died suddenly last night about six o'clock. He had been in his usual good health until Saturday afternoon about four o'clock, when he complained of feeling ill and left for home. Medical attendance was immediately summoned, but a fatal termination of his illness was quite unexpected. Mr. Kiernin had been in the employ of Sisson, Cutler & Co. for over a quarter of a century, and was one of the best known and most popular men in the North End, and widely known throughout the city. His death will be a great shock to his many friends.

MARINE INQUIRY BEGINS THIS WEEK
OTTAWA, April 19—The inquiry into the charges of dishonesty by the civil service commissioners against officials of the marine department will be commenced this week at Quebec by Judge Cassels. To make the inquiry through it has been decided by the government that counsel shall be employed to assist the judge. This is more necessary as the charge of dishonesty did not specify any official in particular, but was a general statement that there had been dishonest operations by some officials in the department.

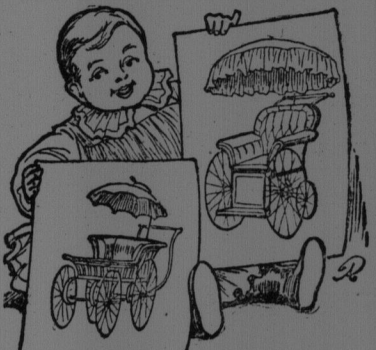
HALIFAX CALL DELAYS EMPRESS 20 HOURS
