

SOCIALISTS WIN BIG VICTORIES IN ELECTIONS

Returns from Belgium Elections Show Catholics and Liberals to Have Lost Many Seats to Socialist Group.

Brussels, Nov. 15.—The returns in the general elections up to a late hour today show a socialist gain of eight seats, of which the Catholics lost six and the liberals two. There are indications of socialist progress everywhere. It seems certain that the Catholics will lose their majority in the Chamber.

The polling was considerably hampered by the snow, many trains being delayed thereby. The snow is three feet deep in the province of Luxembourg and many of the voters in the province of Liege were unable to reach polling booths.

Latest Report. Brussels, Nov. 16.—(Havas)—The latest reports are to the effect that the Catholics have lost about fifteen seats and the Liberals seven seats to the Socialists.

DELEGATION OF WOMEN WAIT ON PRIME MINISTER

Present Number of Resolutions Passed by Federated Women's Institute of Canada.

OTTAWA, Ont., Nov. 15.—A delegation from the Federated Women's Institutes of Canada waited on Hon. C. J. Doherty, acting Prime Minister, this morning and presented a number of resolutions passed by the Federation at its recent meeting in Toronto. The resolutions advocate uniform divorce law; that the salaries of husbands, guilty of desertion, shall be paid to the wives they have deserted; that railway companies place conveniences for women on trains; that when naturalization is granted it be marked by an appropriate ceremony; and also resolutions dealing with the sale of consent and the sale of narcotics. Mr. Doherty promised consideration by the Government of the resolutions.

THE DEDICATION SERVICE AT ST. DAVID'S CHURCH YESTERDAY

New Sacred Edifice Crowded to the Doors During Impressive Services—Rev. Clarence MacKinnon, D. D., Preached Morning and Evening—Kindly Greetings and Congratulations from Local Clergymen.

We, now, the people of this church and congregation, gathered here to-day with a great cloud of witnesses, grateful for our heritage, sensible of the sacrifices of the fathers, conscious that apart from us their work cannot be made perfect, do dedicate ourselves anew to the worthy worship of God in this place and to the constant service of God in the Christian service of man.

These words, from the very beautiful Dedication Service which was held yesterday at the new St. David's Church give a key-note of the services held during the day. Four times during the service the building was thronged with worshippers, the number of persons being so great in the evening that those in charge were forced to close the doors a quarter of an hour before the time set for the service as every seat was then filled.

The morning service of dedication opened with an organ prelude, followed by an anthem "Ye Gates Lift Up Your Heads" (St. George, Edinburg). After the reading of Scripture and singing of appropriate hymns, including the time-honored "Oh God of Bethel" the Dedication was made. Rev. J. A. MacKinnon, D. D., minister of St. David's stating the proper and sacred uses for which the building was intended: "To the glory of God"—"To the Honor of Jesus," "To the praise of the Holy Spirit," and participating in the many-sided forms of military and worship for which strength and guidance was asked. After the minister had spoken, the choir sang "We dedicate this house." The ceremony was a most inspiring one and devout prayers were made for blessing to rest upon the church and people.

Rev. Clarence MacKinnon, D. D., Principal of the Theological College, Halifax, N. S., read the lesson from the Scripture and also preached the sermon taking his text from Acts 2:19. Dr. MacKinnon asked two questions, first "Have we seen the Lord?" and second "Are we obedient to the vision?" The experience of St. Paul was described and it was pointed out that while we might not have a vision of Christ as had Stephen, St. Paul, St. Augustine, or St. Bernard, yet in the needy ones of the world our Lord had taught us to see Himself. This was illustrated by the story of the Legion. Speaking on the second question "Are we obedient to the heavenly vision?" he pointed out that the world was never so much in need of Christianity as today. Without Christianity the world had ended in the materialism of the nineteenth century. The only security for human society is the faith in God. The ideals of righteousness but cannot attain to them. Rev. J. A. MacKinnon conducted the service and the responses were given by W. E. Magee. Principal MacKinnon D. D. made an address telling the scholars of the part they could play in the work of the church and of its dedication to the service of God. Robert Reid is superintendent of the Sunday School.

Opening at 3.45 p. m. this service was designed to give expression to the common purpose of all our churches and to promote the unity and power of the Forward Movement. The singing of the Doxology began the service followed by prayer by Rev. J. A. MacKinnon. The Scripture lesson was read by Rev. Alexander Grant a returned soldier, and prayer offered by Rev. E. E. MacL. Smith organist of the Forward Movement.

Rev. J. A. MacKinnon extended, on behalf of the Kirk Session, a cordial welcome to the ministers of other churches who were present. Their sympathy at the loss of St. David's suffered had been very sincere and he was sure they were sharing the joy of the day. All had one great purpose though different methods. The service was presided over by Rev. J. A. MacKinnon, D. D., assisted by Rev. J. H. Jenner, Rev. H. A. Cody, Rev. J. H. Hickey. AGREEMENT WAS REACHED SATURDAY

Shipping Companies' Representatives and Longshoremen's Union Agree on Rates of Pay—An Advance for Men—Changes in Working Conditions.

It was announced Saturday that an agreement had been reached between the representatives of the shipping companies and the Longshoremen's Union regarding the rates of pay and other conditions to govern the winter port season. The men will receive an advance of 10 cents per hour, with the usual differential for handling grain, bulk salt, sulphur, etc. Some changes will also be made in the working conditions, the principal one being an increase in the number of men forming a deal gang. The working day will be recognized as nine hours, but there will be the same rate of pay—seventy cents an hour—for both day and night work. The shipping companies and coal companies have made an offer to the coal handlers which was submitted to a meeting of the men's union yesterday. Information as to the decision of the union was given out, but it was said the men's representatives will have another interview with the employers today, and it is expected that a settlement will be reached somewhat on the lines of the compromise in the case of the longshoremen.
