Ontario and prohibiting the export of unsawn lumber from Crown lands, or compelling the manufacture of pulp and paper in Canada from pulpwood cut on guehe lands. In Quebee there are several reasons for this. One is that the Government of the day is in honor bound by the action of the Parent Administration in fixing the Provincial tariff or tax on pulpwood cut on Crown lands at a special field rate for ten years, which period expires in 1910.
