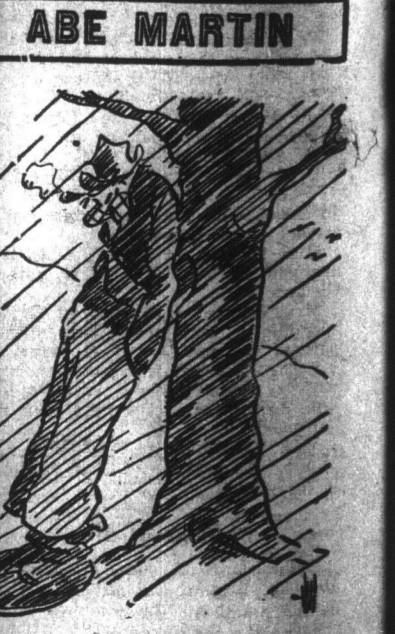
Meaning it is the business of the virtuous government to see to it that every, the government's official, is in court on the 16th. If he is absent when his name is called the public will know where to place the responsibility.

The Rose Jar—I can just hear you saying that you meant to ask me for those directions for making this potpourri again this year, so I offer them without waiting for the deluge of requests that come to me every rose season.

3,000 TO MOVE ON CAMP SUSSEX.

Redcoat to Pass From Drill Order With This Year's Camp. PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND TO SEND PARTY OF SIGNALLERS IN FORCE.

More than 3,000 men will go under canvas on Camp Sussex on Tuesday week. Camp will not be broken up until July 30.

Advances Parties. About the 20th of the camp commandant will take charge. The Army Service Corps will get out on Tuesday the 17th.

Units for Camp. The units will be as follows: 8th Princess Louise Hussars, commanded by Colonel McDougall; 23rd N. B. Dragoons will be in the charge of the food.

SOME DETAILS OF CANADA'S TRADE LAST FISCAL YEAR.

Was Over a Billion of Which \$611,000,000 Was With United States. Marked Falling Off in Imports While Exports Show a Substantial Increase, Particularly With Britain—Trade With West Indies Less.

Ottawa, June 18—A statement of Canadian trade for the last fiscal year has just been issued by the trade and commerce department. The total trade in merchandise for the year was \$1,617,766,086, an increase of \$26,897,556 over the corresponding fiscal year.

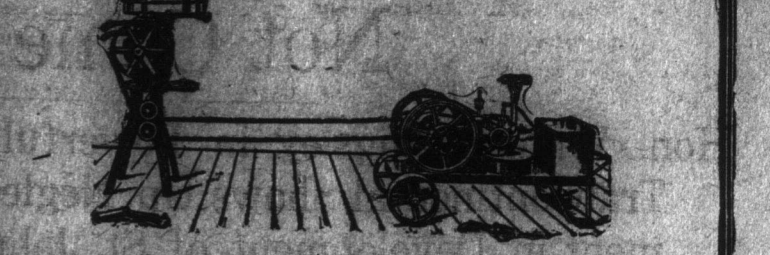
There was a much greater movement of coin and bullion during the year than during 1912-1913. Imports of coin and bullion totalled \$19,288,350, an increase of \$9,307,876.
