

The question was discussed some weeks ago by the cabinet, but it was then decided, and semi-officially announced, that no action would be taken along the lines of conscription, and that there would be another session of par-liament with an appeal for a further year's extension. Situation Grows Worse. The drastic action now proposed by some of Premier Borden's advisers is to forthwith announce a policy of modified conscription, backing up the national service board with some real authority to get after the slackers and allocate men either to the ranks of the overseas forces or to the necessary works of production on which depend continued we output of munitions, etc. So far as can be learned at present the government is now wavering between the alternatives of meeting parliament, and hanging on to power for at least another few months, or of taking the plunge now and getting it all over with quickly on a bold issue.
