

BOYD, NATHANIEL (*Macdonald*).

S. of Hugh Boyd, railway contractor, and Maria Kilfoyle, natives of Irel., whose parents settled in the Co. of Argenteuil, P.Q., about 1820. B. in the Co. of Argenteuil, 9 July, 1853, and ed. in the Common Schools of the City of Ottawa. M., 12 June, 1878, dau. of F. Abbott, Ottawa, late Supt. of Rideau Canal. Was for some years employed by the Montreal Telegraph Co. as an Operator in the House of Commons, and subsequently as a chief train despatcher, and Assist. Superintendent of Section 15 of the C.P.R. Co. in Manitoba. Is now engaged in cattle ranching. An unsuccessful candidate for Marquette at g. e., 1891. First returned to House of Commons at bye-election, held July, 1892, and re-elected at g. e., 1896. A Conservative.—*Carberry*.

BRITTON, BYRON MOFFATT, Q.C. (*Kingslon*).

S. of D. F. Britton of Gananoque, who came from New Hampshire. Mother came from New York State. B. at Gananoque, Ont., 3 Sept., 1833. Graduated from Victoria Univ. in 1856. M., 22 Dec., 1863, Mary E., eldest dau. of the late Hon. L. H. Holton. Called to the Bar of U.C., 1859, and apptd. Q.C., 13 Aug., 1881. Has been a Bencher of the Law Soc., Ont., for some years. Was Mayor of Kingston in 1876; Chairman of School Board for several years, and County Attorney and Clerk of the Peace for the Co. of Frontenac from 1882 to 1891, when he resigned. Was an unsuccessful candidate for Cataraqui in the Leg. Council of Can. in 1864. First returned to House of Commons at g. e., 1896. A Liberal.—*Kingston*.

BRODER, ANDREW (*Dundas*).

S. of William Broder, a native of Killfree, Co. of Sligo, Irel. Mother, a native of Belfast. B. in Franklin, Co. of Huntingdon, P.Q., in 1845. Ed. there, and at Malone, N.Y., Academy. Was in business as merchant until 1892, when he was apptd. a Customs officer at Morrisburg; resigned on becoming a candidate for present seat. Sat in Leg. Assem. of Ontario from 1875 to 1886. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1896. A Conservative.—*Morrisburg, Ont.*
