## BILL.

## An Act to define more accurately the boundaries which separate the Counties of Sherbrooke Drummond and Megantic.

HEREAS the terms of the Act of the Legislature Preamble. of Lower Canada, passed in the ninth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, chaptered seventythree, and intituled, "An Act to make a new and more Act of L. C. 5 " convenient sub-division of the Province into Counties, for 9 Geo. 4, c. 73.

"the purpose of effecting a more equal representation "thereof in the Assembly than heretofore," contained in the ninth, thirteenth and fourteenth sections, are indefinite and contradictory, and it is expedient to define with

<sup>10</sup> more precision the boundaries which shall separate the said Counties: Be it therefore enacted, &c.

That the boundary line of the said County of Megantic, Boundaries of commencing at the southerly angle of the Township of Megantic. Chester, shall run along the south-easterly line of Chester

- 15 to the westerly angle of the Township of Wolfestown; thence along the line between the Townships of Ham and Wolfestown to the most southerly angle of Wolfestown; thence along the line between Wolfestown and Garthby to the most easterly angle of Wolfestown, and
- 20 thence in a south-easterly direction along the line which separates the Townships of Colborne, Price, Lambton, Aylmer and Gayhurst on the north-east, from the Townships of Garthby, Stratford, Winslow and Whitton on the south-west thereof, until it strikes the River Chaudière.
- 25 II. And be it enacted, That the said County of Sher- Boundaries of brooke shall extend to and be bounded by the said County Sherbrooke. of Megantic to the east; and that the boundary separating the said County of Sherbrooke from the County of Drummond, commencing at the most southerly angle of
- <sup>30</sup> Wolfestown, shall run along the line between the Township and augmentation of Ham, to the most southerly angle of the said Township of Ham; thence along the line between the Townships of Ham and Wotton to the most northerly angle of Wotton, and thence along the
- 35 line between Wotton and Tingwick to the most casterly angle of the Township of Shipton.
