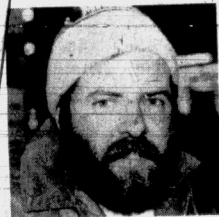


Christmas

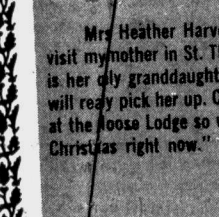

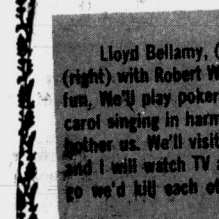
