With three players sidelined by injuries and others hobbling with minor ailments, Mississauga dropped its seventh game in 10 starts on Saturday with a 3-0 loss to Polonia at Lamport Stadium in Toronto.

"The play is improving every game," says Aldo Lista, coaching the team in Frank Gilmore's absence. "But we've got so many injuries we can't improve in the standings."

Mississauga battled Polonia to a scoreless tie after 40 minutes of play, with goalkeeper Lou Battagin stopping a Polonia penalty shot.

But a second penalty shot found the back of the net before the half ended. Two second-half goals gave Polonia the victory.

Mississauga played the game with Chris Martin, Bernie Eidemire and Tony D'Alfonso. Bantams Manuel Silva, Mike Uremovich, Giancarlo Lista, and Tony Collins were called up for the game even though they played an Ontario Cup game earlier in the day.

Things aren't looking any better this weekend as Mississauga hosts first-place St. Catharines Roma at 3 p.m. at St. Lawrence Starch Field on Sunday.

## Anning gets a chance with Chicago Sting

Les Anning's dream is coming closer to reality.

Anning, a forward with Clarkson of the Intercities Senior Soccer League, has been invited for a four-game trial with the Chicago Sting of the North American Soccer League.

The 25-year-old Mississaugan will leave for Chicago on July 19 and appear in his first NASL game on July 21.

"I'm really looking forward to it," says Anning. "I'm trying not to be nervous, but it isn't easy."

Anning, who got the tryout by calling Sting general manager Jim Walker, has had several contacts with soccer teams since a story on him appeared in The Mississauga Times three weeks ago.

He's been contacted by the Canadian national soccer team and has been invited to several NASL training camps next spring. In addition, Anning is looking into two offers from European soccer teams.

"Everything's working out great," he says. "A lot of people have helped me out and I owe them a lot."

He hopes to repay them by landing a position with the Sting.
