Excellency that the Superintendent  
General has been pleased  
to express approval generally  
of the Report. The Superintendent  
General adds, however that a  
considerable proportion of the  
boys should have had  
Blacksmithing and Carpentry  
especially, - that healthy or  
delicate boys might be taught  
Tailoring, Harness-making  
and writing in the way in which  
you propose. The Superintendent  
General thinks that some  
steps should be taken as  
long as train Indian girls &  
serious industries, who might  
intermarry with the trained  
Indian youth, who otherwise
