Ottawa, Nov. 27, 1912.

Sir,

With reference to your letter of Oct. 7, last, and enclosures relating to the drainage of a portion of the Six Nations Reserve near Sixty-nine Corners, I beg to inform you that it is proposed to send an officer from the Department to make the necessary survey and estimate of cost of the work. If the weather permits this gentleman may be sent in a short time, if not, he will visit the reserve next spring.

The suggestion of the Secretary of the Six Nations Council to the effect that on account of the Six Nations Indians not being able to take advantage of the Ontario Drainage Act they may be able to obtain loans for the construction of under drains on their property, will be considered after the surveyor's report has been received.
