Sir,

Referring to your letter of July 23, last, and previous correspondence, I beg to inform you that the Department of the Interior has finally consented to an exchange of lands in the interest of the Indians of the Pine River Indian Reserve No. 66A. The exchange as consented to by the said Department is somewhat modified from that desired by the Indians. It is, however, a decided improvement as it leaves the reserve in a more compact form.

Biank forms of surrender have been sent to Mr. Robert Logan, Indian Agent, Portage la Prairie, with authority to take the necessary surrender from the Indians of the lands they relinquish in exchange for the block to be granted them.
