Dear Mr. Graham -

I have your letter of the 16th instant, with reference to the educational work on Cote's Reserve.

Some days ago I had almost concluded to discharge or transfer to other schools all the girls and conduct the institution for a time at least for boys only. I was afraid, however, that this might prove a hardship both to some of the children and also to the Church, and I am asking that a new Principal be appointed. We will keep the school running as it is until next year.

I am disposed to agree with you that a combination day and boarding school would best meet the needs of the Cote Reserve. When a decision is finally arrived at the plans will be prepared in the Department. In the meantime I should be very glad to have a pencil sketch of a building that
