QUOTE, My dear Lord Athlone: I have been

greatly pleased to receive word from The King that His
Majesty believed that you would be prepared to give
favourable consideration to an offer of appointment as
Governor General of Canada, and that, if made, His
Majesty would be very ready to approve the recommendation.

Before receiving this phasing assurance from The King, I had drafted a letter to The King asking His Majesty's approval of the appointment of yourself to this office, should it be possible to obtain your acceptance of the offer if made.

At a meeting of the Cabinet yesterday afternoon, the first to be held since the general elections of Tuesday last, the 26th instant, I discussed with my colleagues the advice to be tendered The King as to Lord Tweedsmuir's successor in the office of Governor General. I am sure you will be pleased to know that when I mentioned to my colleagues my intention to sabmit your name to The King for his approval, the proposed
