

Third Witness for
prosecution.

D150045 Fusilier Armand Freniere, Les Fusiliers
Mont-Royal, Canadian Army Overseas, having been duly
sworn states :

At Hursley during Harlequin a Sunday noon
Cpl Roy asked me if I could change him a 10 shillings
note. I looked in my wallet I had only 2 10 shillings
notes and about 7 or 8 shillings. I put in my side
pocket the silver and copper and placed my wallet in
my rear pocket. About 15 minutes afterwards I lent
my trousers to Cpl Lagacé. I emptied my side pockets
but forgot to empty the rear pocket. I remembered about
the wallet about an hour afterwards. I notified Cpl
Lorion. My wallet was black, had a year and a half use,
and had a zipper. In it was my identity card, Magog and
other papers including receipts from the Quarter-Master
but no photos of myself.
Monday morning he returned the pants but no wallet.
I asked for it. He said he had not seen it.

The accused declines to cross-examine this
witness.

Question to the accused:

Do you wish to make any statement or to give evidence
upon oath? You are not obliged to say anything or give evidence
unless you wish to do so, but whatever you say or any
evidence you give will be taken down in writing and
may be given in evidence.

Answer by the accused:

"I have nothing to say".
