

A. Thirty miles.

Q. Has he any land there?

A. Yes.

Q. Is that all the land you want?

A. (Examining map) I want some more land marked Lot 351.

Mr Commissioner Shaw: That is marked "Pre-emption" but it may be open for pre-emption. We don't know whether we can get that piece for you or not - Is there any more land that you want?

A. (Examining map) I want the South fractional half of Lot 356, also the south fractional half of Lot 355, and I want Lot 353.

Q. (Examining map) I think we can give you all this land, as from the map it appears to be nearly all open. Now about ^K Cahoose, How many cattle has Cahoose?

A. Eighteen head of cattle.

Q. How many horses?

A. Sixty.
