- A. Thirty miles.
- Q. Has he any land there?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Does he own it?
- A. No.
- Q. Is it part of an Indian Reserve?
- A. No.
- Q. And he wants to get that land?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Did he get anyone to buy the land for him?
- A. No.
- Q. And you yourself want some more land besides the piece you have?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Where do you want it?
- A. (Examining map) I want land south of Lot 24, commencing at the S.W.corner of Lot 398, Pre-emption record 2363, thence West to Abuntlet lake, thence following the river and lake to the place of commencement, and containing, more or less, 320 acres.
- Q. Is that all the land you want?
- A. (Examining map) I want some more land marked Lot 351.
- Mr Commissioner Shaw: That is marked "Pre-emption" but it may be open for pre-emption. We don't know whether we can get that piece for you or not Is there any more land that you want?
- A. (Examining map) I want the South fractional half of Lot 356, also the south fractional half of Lot 355, and I want Lot 353.
- Q. (Examining map) I think we can give you all this land, as from the map it appears to be nearly all open. Now about Cahoose.

 How many cattle has Cahoose?
- A. Eighteen head of cattle.
- Q. How many horses?
- A. Sixty.
