The Board of Governors is elected by the Convention of Ontario and Quebee. The teaching of McMaster will be exactly what the Baptists of this Convention anthorize. If you wish the Higher Critical views inculcated, then elect members to the Board who will see that it is done. But if on the other hand you desire that the historic position of the Baptists with regard to the Bible should be maintained, then pass resolutions at the Associations and at the Convention expressing this to be your view; insist on candidates for the Board of Governors stating to the Convention their views on this question, that we may not vote in the dark, and then elect members to the Board who take the conservative position and who will vote for conservative teaching. The importance of this question in our educational work overshadows every other. Let the denomination be heard from.

If the position on this question of any member of the Committee of Seven, or any member of the Board, is misunderstood, the opportunity is open to make it clear. There ought to be no hesitation on the part of any person concerned to declare clearly where he stands on this matter.
