12th. The Council hope that the next Annual Prize Meeting may be held in Nova Scotia, and they have reason to expect that sufficient inducements will be held out in that Province to ensure the Meeting taking place at Halifax.

13th. The Council refer gratefully on this as on former occasions, to the continued liberal support accorded to the Association, by the Government of the Dominion, through the HONOURABLE THE MINISTER OF MILITIA AND DEFENCE, and they respectfully request a renewal of that assistance which has so far materially contributed to the marked efficiency in shooting of the Canadian Active Militia.

14th. The Council beg also in similar terms to acknowledge the support received during the past year from His Excellency the GOVERNOR GENERAL and the President of the Association.

15th. The Meeting at Fredericton was opened by His Honor the Lieut.-Governor of New Brunswick, who, together with several ladies and gentlemen, repeatedly honoured the Meeting with their presence.

16th. The Council beg to refer to the annexed Special Report of the President and Treasurer upon the expenses incurred in carrying out the Meeting at Fredericton.

17th. The Secretary's Report, together with a List of the Matches, and the Scores of the successful competitors, is also appended.

18th. The Council tender their thanks to Lt.-Col. MACPHERSON, for the performance of his duties as Treasurer, etc., and to the Secretary, Lieut.-Colonel STUART, for his services as Secretary.
