HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion benchmarked, and the Northwark Torritories, excepting i and 28, which has not been homestendid, or esse red to provide word lots for sections, or for uncer purposes, may be hout bend of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter see tion of 100 arcs, more or less.

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the loca land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homestender desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winniper, or the Local Agence the site for the complexity of the site of the the entry of the site of the site of the site of the site of the of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Landa Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:-

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father for mother, if the father is decaused) or any person who is eligible to make a homescal entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to re-sidence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of auch patent: Con Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock with buildings for their accommodation, and have bosides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

hould be made at the end of the three years fore the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the iomestead Inspector. Before making applica-on for patent the settler must give six months only on writing to the Commissioner of comminou Lands at Ottawa of his intention to
