MR. *Attorney General* moved, seconded by Mr. *Solicitor General*, that the copy of the record of the proceedings against *Charles Baptiste Bouc*, Esquire, a Member of this House, upon the indictment in the Court of King's Bench for the District of *Montreal*, which was laid before this House and read on the twelfth day of April last, in obedience to the order of this House, on the tenth day of April then next preceding, be taken into consideration on Monday the thirty first day of March instant; and that the said *Charles Baptiste Bouc* do then attend this House in his place.

Mr. *Berthelot* moved, seconded by Mr. *Martineau* in amendment, that after the word "consideration" all the words to "instant" inclusive be struck out, and that, "the fifteenth of the month of June" be substituted in lieu thereof.

The House divided upon the question.

Nays 20

Negatived by a majority of seventeen.

And the main question being put, a division again ensued:

Nays 3

So the same being carried by a majority of seventeen votes, it was ORDERED, accordingly.
