Two Petitions of the Board of Trade of the City of Quebec; praying that the Articles No. 44 of the Title of Obligation, and No. 1 of the Title of Sale, of the Civil Code of Canoda, may not become Law,—and also praying for certain amendments to the Bill to amend and consolidate the Acts relating to the Water Works of the City of Quebec.

Of the Reversed W. M. Seaborn and others, of Kildare, Joliette, and St. Alphonse, in the County of Joliette; and of James Read and others, of Ramsay; severally praying for the redress of certain grievances connected with the subject of Protestant Education in Lower Canada.

Of John McGuiness and others, of the Township of Amherst Island; praying against the passing of an Act to separate the said Township from the County of Lennox and Addington and annex the same to the County of Frontenac.

Of Joseph Wright and others, of the County of Wentworth; praying for certain amendments to the Fishery Laws.

Of the Natural History Society of the City of Montreal; praying for the continuance of their annual grant.

Of the Corporation of the City of *Montreal*; praying for an Act explaining and extending certain enactments of the Acts incorporating the said City, and for other purposes.

Of James L. Mathewson and others, of the City of Montreal; praying to be incorporated as "The Irish Protestant Benevolent Society of Montreal."

Of John Supple and others, Provisional Directors of the Canada Central Railway Company; praying for an Act defining their powers and extending the time for the commencement of the said Railway.

And of the Lady Managers of the University Lying-in-Hospital of *Montreal*; praying for the continuance of their annual grant.

The Honorable the Speaker presented to the House,—Returns of the Baptisms, Marriages and Burials in the Counties of *Soulanyes* and *Chateauguay*, for the year 1864.

Ordered, That the same do lie on the table, and they are as follow:
