The SHAME OF QUEBEC.

When the students of Quebec assaulted a guest who was entitled to protection, as a woman, and to respect, as one of the great artists of the world, there was a feeling of shame and mortification which was shame and mortification which was promptly voiced by the Premier of Canada. People naturally asked "are these the gallant sons of France! To Prove That Hyomei Will Cure Is such rowdyism characteristic of Quebec f"

Last Monday a crowd in the city of Quebec again disgraced their province and the Dominion of Canada. They stoned and assaulted their fellow citizen and representative in Parliament, Armand Lavergne, a young man of talent and of irreproachable character. The same treatment was accorded to Mr. Bourassa, confessedly one of the most brilliant men in Canada and one who stands without reproach in public or private life. They broke up a public meeting called to discuss the affairs of their province and proclaimed that the right of free speech did not exist in their historic capital.

It will be interesting to note how this outrage is received by those in whose behalf it was committed. Was it the outbreak of drunken hoodlums, or did it result from the preaching of Sir Wilfrid Laurier's personal or gan, Le Soliel, and from the resolutions passed by the Laurier club'. The outrage was predicted and justified in advance upon the ground that to hold a public meeting in his riding of East Quebec to discuss charges of corruption against provincial ministers of a Liberal Government would be an insult to Sir Wilfrid Laurier.
