Second class females, for first two years, \$81; for the next five, \$90; then, \$100.

Third class females, first \$63; then \$70; after seven years, \$80 a

Assistant teachers shall receive half the above sum.

By section four of the bill the teacher of a superior school holding a license of the superior or grammar school class shall receive a sum not exceeding \$250 per anum, as at present, during the first seven years, and after seven years the sum of \$275, provided the trustees of the district shall pay an equal amount.

Every teacher of a grammar school holding a grammar school heense and doing grammar school work, shall receive \$350 per annum as at present, provided, however, that not more than four teachers in any one grammar school shall receive the grammar school grant.

The principal of a grammar school, after seven years' service, who has supervision of the department of other teachers in the same school building or in the same district, shall receive an additional sum of \$50 per annum.

This act shall not go into force until after the additional subsidy of \$130,000 a year has been received \$25,000 to the school grants, or an average of about \$13

Shanghai, April 12.-Ten million people are reported starving in China. The Chinese government has contributed \$4,000,000, and \$500,000 has been received from foreign sources. A dollar, the relief committee reports, will save one life until the harvest, June 25, and \$10,000,000 are needed. The whole amount cannot be raised in China. The situation is desperate and Americans are urged to give \$3,-000,000 in the next few weeks, not for Christian, but for humanitarian work.
