States treated the matter so far as the rights of Canadians is concerned. Our readers will remember the arbitray seizure by United States cutters, of Canadian vessels a few years ago, when these vessels were legitimately pursuing their avocation of catching seals in the open sea, about seventy miles from land. The seals found on board these vessels were unjustly confiscated; the vessels detained and their officers fined, imprisoned, and most cruelly treated in Alaska.

That the contention of the United States Government is absure and untenable, and that their own conduct in striving for its recognition is most inconsistent, can be easily shown. They now put for ward the theory that Behring Sea, a body of water as extensive as the Mediterranean, is a mare clause years ago, when Alaska belonged to Russia, a similar claim was made by the latter country, which was most strenuously and successfully opposed by the Government of the United

Recently a phase of the question has come to light which does no redound to the honor of the authori ties at Washington, and which leave little room to hope that the Govern ment of the United States will treat the matter with anything like fair play.
