The afternoon session of the house of commons on Wednesday the 7th. was adjourned on Tuesday the 6th. and did not business. The reason was that the government tried to get the second reading of a bill before it was ready, and when the objection was taken Laurier refused to allow any other business to be done and adjourned the house.
