AS YOU LIKE IT.

VIENNA, May 21.
Conflicting reports of revolution in Bulgaria have been received here. One says King Boris has fled, and that Premier Stamboulsky, representing peasants and Agrarians, has proclaimed a republic.

KRASSIN FOR GERMANY.

BERLIN, May 21.
A special despatch from Moscow announces the appointment of Leonid Krassin, Russian Bolshevik representative in London, as Soviet Ambassador to Germany.

U. S. MAY ENTER.

WASHINGTON May 22.
Participation of United States in economic councils abroad, when the governments of Europe are ready to eliminate political questions from their discussions of world rehabilitation, was forecast last night in official circles.

SEINE TO BLAME.

BRIST, May 22.
Ninety-eight passengers are missing, and two hundred and forty-two saved of those who were on board the steamer Egypt when she sank off Ushant, Saturday night, following collision with the French steamer Seine, according to the latest official figures.

The purser says the Egypt was not moving, and was sounding her siren continuously when struck.

PEACEFUL BELFAST.

BELFAST, May 22.
The most disquieting feature of yesterday's disorders in Belfast was the shifting of the centre of the trouble to Ballymagarrett, east end section, where there is a large artisan population, and a small compact Sinn Fein community living in the area called Short Strand. During yesterday night's shooting, gunmen opened fire on the city electric station, but a return fire from police and troops caused the assailants to withdraw.

TANGLING THE ISSUE.

LONDON, May 22.
Surprise and dissatisfaction are the predominant notes in the comment of London leading newspapers on the agreement reached in Dublin on Saturday between leaders of the opposing political factions. Most of the editorial writers regard it as a surrender of Michael Collins to Eamonn De Valera, and do not see how it will enable the Irish people to express their will respecting the situation.
